

Maine Roads To Quality Professional Development Network State FY 25 Q1 Summary Report

Maine Roads to Quality Professional Development Network (MRTQ PDN) is dedicated to advancing professionalism in the early childhood and out-of-school time (OST) domains through the implementation of a statewide professional development system. MRTQ PDN provides a range of services, including:

- The MRTQ Registry
- Core Knowledge, On-Demand, and Elective Training
- Credentialing and Apprenticeship
- Quality Initiatives
- Technical Assistance through
 - o On-site consultation
 - Outreach
 - The Warm Line
 - Facilitated peer-to-peer networks including cohorts, communities of practice, and professional learning communities.

Additionally, MRTQ PDN provides support to programs of all settings regarding *Rising Stars for ME*; Maine's quality rating and improvement system, Child Care Choices, and meeting the health and safety requirements for compliance with the Child Care Development Block Grant (CCDBG).

Along with the submitted Quarterly Report, which outlines the MRTQ PDN's advancement toward fulfilling our performance measures as per the contract, the following is a summary of notable contributions made during the first quarter to promote professionalism in our field, enhance the quality of care, and establish a statewide professional development system.




MRTQ Registry

This quarter, the MRTQ Registry has gained 1,002 new members. The start of the school year in September tends to be a busy month for the Registry, 43% of those new members joined in September alone. This puts the overall active membership at 22,276, of which, 93% are direct care providers.



A new school year also means an influx of education and training documents submitted to the Registry for verification towards the providers' professional development profiles. In this quarter, the Registry Team processed and verified 643 education documents, and **100% of those documents were processed within five business days**.





The Registry Team responded to **4,894 email requests** in the first quarter. Most of these are education and training documents that require processing by the team, and many others include requests for support with accessing the Registry, understanding the Career Lattice, or other technical support questions. A special mention to **Shane Plumer**, who was promoted into the role of Registry Coordinator in September and is responsible for the management of Registry communications.

Training

Jason D'Amico was hired as the Technical Assistance and Data Specialist for MRTQ Training, a new position and with a different skillset in replacement of the former Project Assistant. Jason has already shown that he understands complex systems, and is able to think critically and independently to support our team and providers. We have expanded the responsibilities of this role to include more robust work with our training evaluations, training content review and provider support.

Q1 also marks the first three months of the Training Team having a dedicated manager. **Danielle Gismondi** stepped into this role in late June and has been working to hire a replacement for the Training Coordinator role that has been vacant. We are excited about what we can accomplish as a new and expanded team.

From July to September we began 23 facilitated trainings. 7 trainings were complete by the end of September with a completion rate of 76%. Out of the 23 trainings beginning in this quarter MRTQ had an 87% enrollment rate. We launched the updated Health and Safety Orientation, and 1,033 providers completed this ondemand training!

The on-demand training *Preschool Maine Early Learning and Development Standards* became available to everyone beginning in July. It provides an overview of the newly developed P-MELDS with a focus on each domain and ideas for integrating the content into a variety of settings. Each module introduces content and highlights specific practices and skills designed to foster the participant's abilities to use the P-MELDS independently once the training is complete. The training also has an intentional focus on principles for working with diverse populations and creating inclusive, developmentally appropriate learning environments. This quarter **604** participants have completed the training!



In collaboration with CCIDS we updated the training *Creating Inclusive Preschool*Settings to reflect the most up-to-date terminology and content.

We are currently in the process of updating the on-demand training *Caring for Children and Families Experiencing Homelessness* and *Your Professional Development Portfolio*.

Technical Assistance

MRTQ PDN contains a statewide technical assistance (TA) system that caters to early childhood and out-of-school programs to enhance program quality. This initiative facilitates a reflective process for practitioners to apply their training and education effectively, promoting the implementation and maintenance of best practices.

Technical Assistance Q1 Highlights


Level 3 and 4 consultations remain at record levels across program settings with the highest number related to professional development, followed by administrative policies and procedures. Rising Stars Quality Improvement Awards have contributed to awareness of the variety of services provided by the MRTQ PDN technical assistance team. Along with consultation, Professional Learning Communities (PLCs) are drawing record numbers of participants, for example "Power of Play: Going on a Bear Hunt" offered in Androscoggin County.

21 applications were sent out for new Sponsoring Employers, Registered Apprentices and Mentors. We received back from **9 Sponsoring Employers** and **11 apprentices**. 3 apprentices dropped out before the program began.




Traffic to the Child Care Choices website, based on median daily users and ignoring bot-driven activity, is roughly the same as Quarter 1 in FY 2024.

Quality Improvement - Rising Stars for ME

This quarter, *Rising Stars for ME* data was used to identify "early adopters" – programs that completed a *Rising Stars for ME* application **AND** moved up their program's rating during the initial rollout. The hope is that these early adopters will be eligible for Quality Initiative funding in late 2024 or early 2025 to recognize and reward their enthusiasm.

MRTQ PDN continues to work with OCFS and Help Me Grow to identify ways to improve the information available to families via the Child Care Choices search. Upcoming improvements will include indicating when a program last updated their openings (if ever).

Quality Initiatives

MRTQ PDN is collaborating with the Maine Department of Health and Human Services, Office of Child and Family Services (DHHS, OCFS) to offer Quality Improvement Initiative funding to early childhood and out-of-school time programs in Maine. Quality Initiative funding incentivizes and rewards individuals and programs for taking steps that will improve the quality of their child care program.

Q1 Highlights for Quality Initiatives

Quality Improvement Training & Professional Development: MRTQ PDN manages funds to provide Quality Improvement Awards to child care providers participating in professional development opportunities. *Designing Early Learning: Curriculum and Assessment in Preschool* and *Strengthening Business Practices for Child Care Programs* are the trainings specific to this offering.





Quality Improvement Credential Awards: Credential Quality Improvement Awards (QIA) are provided to recognize and reward individuals who earn a Maine Credential. The Maine Credentials include the Infant Toddler, Youth Development, Director, Inclusion, Technical Assistance, and Family Child Care.

Fifty Maine DOE OST providers in Maine's 21st CCLC project were among the programmers MASN supported at the Positive Youth Development Institute (PYDI). Certificates were issued for SEARCH Institute's Developmental Relationship Framework training and Mizzen Education showcased the OST Mizzen app. Mizzen is a free resource of curated learning resources that offers thousands of K-12 activities that spark curiosity, joy, and a love of learning. Other presenters included Maine Resilience Building Network (Now Maine Youth Thriving), Maine Roads to Quality, Maine Mathematics and Science Alliance, National AfterSchool Association top 25 presenter Brad Lademann, and Richard Irwin from our sister network in Missouri.





Maine Out of School Time (MOST) Career Exploration

MASN supported the MDOE Career Exploration Department by providing technical assistance to a project developed called Maine Out of School Time Career Exploration, which funded new or expanded OST programs serving 4-6 graders to add a career exploration component to their summer program. These geographically diverse programs used local community assets to introduce youth to careers in their communities. We see, as a result of this program, changes in youth opinions of their future. MOST grantees appreciated funding from the MDOE and technical support from MASN.

Center for Community Inclusion and Disability Services



This quarter, CCIDS staff began facilitation of the **accelerated Inclusion Credential Cohort** offered through support from PDG funding with a total of **13 participants**.

With funding support through the PDG initiative **15** individuals completed **Level 1** and **Level 2** of the PreK - 12 Inclusion for Students with Disabilities micro credential.









13 ECE professionals participated in the Inclusion Book Club this quarter, an offering co-facilitated by CCIDS

- 13 ECE providers participated in the Inclusion Book Club co-facilitated by CCIDS.
- **14** OST professionals participated in a **level 3 technical assistance** focusing on high quality inclusive practices for school age children/out of school time childcare.

Two sessions focusing on supporting children with autism and their families in childcare settings were facilitated by CCIDS staff at the Washington County Conference. **50** ECE professionals were in attendance. *See provider comment in Technical Assistance section.*
